On **Wednesday, October 23**, all freshman and sophomore students will sit for a **practice ACT standardized test** as part of Nerinx's comprehensive testing program. The purpose of taking a practice test is to offer students an early experience of ACT test items, provide predicted ACT test scores, and most importantly help educators, students, and parents, identify areas of academic strength, opportunity and growth. While the PreACT 8/9 and PreACT are practice tests, it is a good tool to help introduce students to standardized testing.

Both the PreACT 8/9 (frosch) and PreACT (soph) will follow the same format:

English: (45 questions) - 30 minutes - *(45 minutes extended time)*

Math: (36 questions) - 40 minutes - *(60 minutes extended time)*

Break - 10-15 minutes

Reading: (25 questions) - 30 minutes - *(45 minutes extended time)*

Science: (30 questions) - 30 minutes - *(45 minutes extended time)*

Test day info and reminders:

- **Arrive on campus by 7:55 am** as testing will begin promptly at 8 am
- Bring two #2 pencils - **NO MECHANICAL PENCILS**
- Bring a **CHARGED** calculator!!!! We will not have extra.
- Students can dress down per Nerinx dress down guidelines
- Food and drink are only allowed during the break
- **Testing locations** will be emailed to students the day before testing from the Nerinx Hall Student Success Center email address; **remind your daughter to check her email**
- Dismissal will be **approximately** 11:00-11:15

Students testing with Accommodations:

- **Students receiving extended time will be dismissed approximately** 12:15-12:30
- **Students testing with Audio** accommodations must bring their **computer and headphones**; more information about Audio will be emailed from a Learning Consultant

****Please remember that students cannot have a cell phone or any smart device during testing. It must be powered down prior to entering the test room!**
